THE PASSING OF CHARLES ALBERT SHAMBAUGH..... In our last issue we made mention of one of the worthy descendents of Philip Shambaugh of Cumberland County and at this time it is our duty to record his death at his home in Carlisle, Pa. The son of Levi P. and Mary Ellen (Shuff) Shambaugh, he was born Dec. 3, 1873 near Plainfield, Pa. After attending the township schools he entered Dickinson Preparatory, continuing thru Dickinson College and graduating from the Law School in 1899 with the degree LLB, soon thereafter he was admitted to the Cumberland County Bar, practicing law over 40 years. Mr Shambaugh was also interested in fire insurance, purchasing the Mutual Fire Insurance Co. in 1916 and later selling it to his brother John E. Shambaugh. He was an active church man, being a member of the Evangelical Church, a teacher of men's classes in SS and a trustee for over 30 years. He was a member of and secretary for the Capt. J P Brindle Camp No. 50 Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War, and as a member of that group helped to make possible the purchase of G A R Memorial Hall. He was interested in education, serving as school director where he was instrumental in the adoption of vocational education, the erection of the annex at Lamberton Bldg and in the planning and building of the Le Tort Building. He was a Democrat in politics and a leader in organizing party affairs. He was a nominee for the Legislature, served a term as secretary and attorney for the Cumberland Co. Board of Poor Directors, was member and past president of the Carlisle Woodrow Wilson Birthday Ass'n. The local newspaper writes of his passing..." As a citizen of our community Mr. Shambaugh was outstanding and will be greatly missed. He supported all good movements, was generous in giving his time and his financial backing in many causes. Both his character and liberality will cause him to be gratefully remembered. " Mr Shambaugh never married but maintained a home for his mother who passed on a few years ago. He is survived by two brothers John E. of Carlisle and the Rev. W I, pastor of the Evangelical Church at Wrightsville, three nephews and eight nieces.

WE HAVE OFTEN WONDERED WHAT FOLKS THOUGHT ABOUT THE NEWS-LETTER.....

Mrs Love writes us, " I received my book a few days ago and I am really proud of it and proud to be a Shambaugh descendant. My father Marion Brinson and Nancy Jane Shambaugh (daughter of Philip Shambaugh and Elizabeth Ramsey) were married in Oregon, Holt. Co, Missouri and came to Kansas a few years later. When my oldest brother Charley was four years old. They came in a covered wagon and drove a yoke of oxen, took a claim where Great Bend is now, then sold it and moved to the north part of Benton Co and filed on 160 acres. They also bought 80 acres of railroad land which they still owned when mother died one year ago on May 3, 1940 at which time it fell to the three children Charley, George and myself, 80 acres to each. My grandfather Phillip Shambaugh was born in Iowa in 1814 and died in 1897. They are both buried in the Clearwater cemetery.

ELLA E LOVE, daughter of Marion Brinson and Nancy Jane Shambaugh was born April 29, 1884 near Dubuque, Kans. She was educated in the country schools near her home. On Nov. 21, 1904 she married Crandall F Love, son of Marion Love and Laura Lavica Bell. Mr. Love, a farmer, was born March 14, 1877 near Bucklin, Mo. Mrs Love is a member of the Friends Church and is a Republican. She is a Past Noble Grand off the Rebecca Lodge, and is also an Eastern Star. Their home is in Conway Springs, Kans. They are parents of Nancy Pearl, born June 30, 1907, now Mrs Melia of Bucklin, mother of Crandall Newton and Edna Elaine; Marion Melvin, born June 15, 1910, father of Billie Don; and, Charles Melvin twin to Marion who died August 3, 1911.

The will of Valentine Shambach dated Dec. 1, 1796, probated Sept. 5, 1808 in Montgomery County names the following children: daughters, Mary wife of John Hugler, Dorothy, wife of John Pennebacker. Son, Philip, realty subject to legacies also remainder of estate. Codicil, dated Dec. 29, 1804 gives to daughter Mary and mentions daughter Elizabeth, deceased. Daughter Dorothy's share to her children

Dotterer, a genealogist who many years ago worked mostly on German families lists the following

- Valentine Shambough born Dec. 31, 1724- died August 31, 1808
- Agnes, wife of Valentine, born Feb. 15, 1727- died Oct. 20, 1822
- Philip, born May 25, 1747- died Oct. 20, 1822 X
- Lydia, wife of Philip, born Nov. 12, 1768- died June 18, 1835
- Valentine, born March 15, 1788- died Sept. 16, 1820
- Letters on the estate of the last named Valentine were granted Oct. 14, 1820
